## **DECISION**

### **FACTS AND ANALYSIS**

This matter arises out of a referral back to the Director of Employment Standards (the “Director”) in an earlier decision of the Tribunal (*Ronald E. Jubb*, BC EST #D284/00). That decision arose out of an appeal by Jubb pursuant to Section 112 of the *Employment Standards Act* (the “Act”), against a Determination of the Director issued on May 5, 2000. The Determination concluded that Jubb was not owed any wages by the Employer. In the earlier decision, I accepted that Jubb was entitled to be paid for 94.6 hours at the rate of \$25 per hour. Less the amount already paid to Jubb, the delegate has now calculated that Jubb is entitled to \$974.73.

The Employer says that he “told the Tribunal that [he] would not be able to attend [the original hearing] because [he] would be on holidays” and would like a hearing. The Employer takes issue with the original decision and the facts set out therein. It appears that he disagrees with the conclusion that Jubb is entitled to additional wages.

Jubb simply wants the money he was owed under the original decision. He does not take issue with the delegate’s calculations.

I am not going to revisit my earlier decision. If the Employer disagrees with the decision, it may apply for reconsideration. I accept the amount calculated by the delegate as the amount owed by the employer to Jubb on account of wages.

### **ORDER**

Pursuant to Section 115 of the Act, I order that the Employer pay to Jubb \$974.73 together with such interest as may have accrued.
